



IOWM-1 Individual Operator Wound Management 2 Day

This course provides the Tactical Operator who possesses limited or no prior medical training the necessary concepts and skills to deliver tactical combat casualty care while operating within the Crisis Site. With the potential for effective hostile fire/threat, IOWM enables the non-medical Tactical Operator to apply practical lifesaving techniques and basic level medical knowledge, skills, and equipment familiarity required to mitigate casualty care until the arrival of a Tactical Emergency Medical Operator or until the casualty can be safely extracted to receiving EMS personnel.

Operators may be required to respond immediately to any casualty situation during law enforcement activity. This training is particularly applicable to Operators deployed to remote sites or operating in temporarily denied environments including small unit tactical operations. This training provides instruction and practical application of casualty assessment, identification, and treatment of common traumatic injuries, and management of common operational medical considerations.
